**ACTIVITY REPORT  
September to November 2021**

Mandates and responsibilities:

- Fishing and Trapping Support Program: overall program administration, technical assistance to the Community programs and management of the regional program;
- Uumajuit Wardens Program: wildlife protection on the land in the marine sectors;
- Environmental Program: technical assistance to the Northern Villages, environmental monitoring, research, climate change and environmental projects;
- Land Use Planning: technical assistance to the Northern Villages and regional planning;
- National Parks development and operation.

**1. INUIT HUNTING, FISHING AND TRAPPING SUPPORT PROGRAM**

- At the end of October, the HSP payments to the communities for administration totaling \$300,000 were deposited to the Community HSP accounts;
- Construction of the new Puvirnituk HSP boat is completed with delivery next summer;
- Technical assistance is being provided to all communities including visits to Tasiujaq and Quaqtaq that were made in September;
- The HSP Landing barge for Kuujjuaraapik is in the tender process;
- Inspections of the Community freezers will not resume this fall due to travel restrictions;
- HF Radios, the Nunavik Land Mobile Radio project:
  - Telephone meetings were held with Kangirsualujuaq, Tasiujaq, Aupaluk, Kangirsuk, Quaqtaq, Ivujivik, Inukjuaq, Umiujaq and Kuujjuaraapik.
  - Technical specifications were finalized and a public call for tenders titled "Design, Supply, Installation and Maintenance of Land Mobile Radio Systems and of User Equipment" was launched on May 13; unfortunately no bid met the technical and legal requirements: consultants are revising the technical specifications and a new public call for tenders will be launched in November with the equipment and antenna structures to be delivered on the first sealift next year.
- A firearms course was delivered in Puvirnituk.
- Following approval by the executive committee for the 1 year funding agreement with Makivik for \$ 1.8M for HSP community hunts and country food sharing agreements have been drafted for each community.

**2. UUMAJUIT WARDENS PROGRAM**

- As of the end of October the wardens completed 901 patrol-days this year and 7 days of search and rescue assistance;
- Weekly telephone meetings with Quebec Wildlife Protection Officers (MFFP) DFO representatives and all wardens are active and ongoing;
- Statistics reporting on Beluga sightings and harvests along with monitoring of hunting on a

- daily basis, ongoing with each warden;
- Joint Patrols with MFFP and wardens from Kuujuaq, Kangiqsualujuaq, Kangirsuk, Salluit, Umiujaq and Kuujuarapik; additional joint patrols with MFFP and DFO went ahead following strict covid protocols;
- A number of complaints have been received from Communities regarding non beneficiaries fishing and the Wardens have been monitoring and verifying sport fishing permits. There have been also multiple reports regarding private helicopters and small aircraft fishing. Files have been opened and investigations on-going by MFFP;
- Assisted DFO survey team in the realization of the beluga survey on the Hudson Bay coast with wardens from Inukjuak, Umiujaq and Kuujuarapik;
- As part of the Nunavik Indigenous Guardians Initiative, the Wardens continue to document and report observations on environmental and climate changes on the land;
- Participated in the monthly meetings of the KRG/DFO Liaison committee;
- Covid 19 guidelines being followed by all wardens;
- Recruitment for a warden in Quaqtak on going as well for Aupaluk
- Budget preparations for 2022 on going

### **3. ENVIRONMENT**

#### **Residual Material Management**

- Nunavik Residual Material Management Plan 2021-2027: Recyc-Québec approved the final version of the Plan in October;
- Participation in the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Nunavik Residual Management working group on October 27. The main items on the agenda were: the Nunavik Residual Material Management Plan 2021-27, the implementation of different recycling programs in the region and the difficulty of accessing the various sources of funding for waste management at both the federal and provincial levels, recyclable materials inventory, ecocenter project updates and contaminated soil management at the residual material site;
- Participation in a meeting with Kuujuaq NV about the ecocenter project and planning the next steps to find sources of funding to carry out the project;
- Participation in a meeting with EPR program in charge of discussing the recycling difficulties in Nunavik (logistic problems), making requests to have the required equipments and planning the shipping of materials;
- Organisation of collection events for hazardous materials in Kangirsuk in September and in Kuujuaq in October;
- Technical assistance for sending residual materials from villages to southern facilities and using the benefit from recycling programs in 2021: 16 marine containers of used tires; 3 marine containers of used electronics, 11 containers of used paint; 10 crates of used vehicle batteries and 3 containers of refrigerant appliances;
- Waste management assessment in Aupaluk and Inukjuak during September to make an inventory on the status of residual material operations and meeting with NV managers;
- Management of the residual hazardous materials stockpile site cleanup program: clean up has been completed in Kangirsuk in September and in Inukjuak in October; this project was able to divert an important quantity of hazardous materials (about 258 tons) from the landfill site in 2021: Inukjuak (37 tons), Kangirsuk (60 tons), Kangiqsualujuaq (20 tons), Quaqtak (23 tons),

Salluit (100 tons), Akulivik (18 tons).

### **Spill Management**

- Continuation of the monitoring and follow-up of hydrocarbon spill reports, and technical assistance and support were provided to the regional organizations in regards to environment regulations and clean-up procedures;
- During this period, 51 spills were reported to the KRG: 11 from mining companies and 40 reported or observed from regional organizations;
- Technical assistance was provided to the NV of:
  - Kangiqsujuaq for completing one environmental rehabilitation at the marina;
  - Kuujjuaq for site assessment of Transport Canada paving project;
- Environmental prevention inspections undertook on municipal building fuel tanks in Akulivik, Kangiqsualujjuaq, Kangirsuk, Inukjuak and Puvirnituk to identify leaks or possible non-compliances;
- Environmental sampling taken in Akilivik (3), Kangiqsualujjuaq (4), Kangirsuk (2), Inukjuak (3) and Puvirnituk (12) to identify possible soil contamination;
- Site characterization in the Northern Village of Puvirnituk in the Tank Farm vicinity.

### **Quarry and Borrow Pits**

- Identification and characterization of sand and gravel resources were done in Kuujjuaraapik with the collaboration of the Northern Village between September 21<sup>st</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

### **Climate Change Adaptation and Monitoring**

- Continuation of collaboration with Makivik in the development of a Nunavik Climate Change Adaptation Strategy. Community visits to present and verify the strategy are planned for early winter 2022 if possible;
- Participation in a peer-to-peer sharing initiative with the Cree Nation Government supported by CIRNAC's Indigenous Community-Based Climate Monitoring program;
- Participation in a Floe Edge Monitoring Service Advisory Committee meeting hosted by C-Core;
- Participation in a "Solar Energy: On the land where to start?" webinar hosted by the First Nation of Quebec and Labrador Sustainable Development Institute (FNQLSDI);
- Trail monitoring project: maintenance of weather station at Deception Bay was made during the last week of September and maintenance of monitoring camera in Kangiqsujuaq was planned, but canceled due to strong winds.

### **Environmental Research**

- Participation in the Nunavik Regional Research Authority steering committee meetings on September 7<sup>th</sup> and October 15<sup>th</sup>;
- Participation in the annual Northern Contaminants Results Workshop held virtually on October 19<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup>;
- Participation in meetings of the ArcticNet Inuit Advisory Committee held on September 8<sup>th</sup> and on October 15<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. Subjects included the development of the Inuit Qaujisarnimut Pilirijjutit. Information on this new research program and funding application forms can be found on the KRG web site.

### **Regional Environment**

- Participated in a meeting of the Kativik Environmental Advisory Committee held on September 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. Items included the Mid Canada Radar line, Asbestos Hill and a presentation on the mechanisms for designation of protected areas in Northern Quebec;

- As part of a pan-arctic research program from Environment Canada (EC), the “Persistent Organic Pollutant” and Mercury samplers were changed on October 1<sup>st</sup>. The sampling site is located about 25 km north of Kuujjuaq;
- Participation in the meeting of the Tata Steel Minerals Iron Ore Mine Environmental and Social Monitoring Committee held virtually on September 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### Caniapiscau Watershed Abandoned Outfitting Camp Clean-up:

- Completion of mobile outfitter camp inspections in the Caniapiscau area on October 6<sup>th</sup>. A total of 45 sites were inspected this year.

#### Nunavik Abandoned Mineral Exploration Restoration:

- Completion of the abandoned mining exploration sites remediation in the Gerido Lake area (86 km West of Kuujjuaq) with a team of workers from Kuujjuaq. Approximately 30 000 lbs of debris and 2500 L of hazardous waste were removed and treated properly. There were 6 locations all in the Gerido Lake area.

## **4. LAND USE PLANNING**

### **Regional Planning**

- Letters of Conformity: during this period, 2 applications of land use occupations were approved;
- Participation and discussion at the “National urban and land use strategy” consultation with the MAMH and preliminary comments regarding the National strategy were sent to the MAMH on September 21<sup>st</sup>. This strategy is used as a lever to help the KRG modify the section regarding land use in the Kativik Act;
- Inspection: following the issuance of a letter of conformity, one mining exploration camp (Camp Valcourt, south of Kuujjuaq) was inspected on September 14<sup>th</sup>;
- Participation in a meeting on the elaboration of the Public Kativik Land Use Plan with Ministry of Energy and Natural Resources on October 20<sup>th</sup>.

### **Municipal Planning, Expansion Plans and Technical Assistance Program**

- Technical assistance was provided to:
  - Quaqtaq for consistent integration of KI construction projects into NV land use plans;
  - Kuujjuaraapik for the surveying the new expansion area;
  - Ivujivik and Kuujjuaq for their numbering system adjustments;
  - Kuujjuaq for the new expansion area drainage issues in collaboration with the MPW department;
- Finalization of Quaqtaq Master Plan and Zoning Bylaw revision, including revision of the maps
- Kangirsuk Sustainable Land-Use Planning project:
  - Analysis and characterization of potential expansion areas;
  - Consultation with Nunavik regional organizations and Kangirsuk local organisations in progress.

### **Geomatics**

- Production of maps for Quaqtaq Master Plan;
- Production of basemaps for the regional fire chiefs meeting of Kuujjuaq.

## **5. PROTECTED AREAS**

### **20% Protected Areas**

- Finalization and signature of the Agreement for the new Sustainable Forest Management Plan (PADF) 2021-2024 which provides funding to carry out work related to the achievement of

regional objectives leading to the conservation of biodiversity and the protection of the territory in the Kativik region:

- Submission of annual projects planning in the context of the PADF Agreement for the period April 2021 to March 2022;
- Drafting the report of the inventory of micromammals in the Cambrien Lake / Nachicapau Lake / Fort Mackenzie (Waskaikinis) Area requested by the MFFP;
- Meeting with MU Conseils to agree on the first stages of the consultation project on protected area planning in Nunavik;
- Planning and participation in an Advisory Committee meeting to validate the MU Conseils approach for the first stages of the consultation project on protected area planning in Nunavik;
- Specific Agreement to preserve the Cambrien Lake / Nachicapau Lake / Fort Mackenzie (Waskaikinis) Areas:
  - Participation in meetings of the *Subcommittee on the search for alternatives to hydroelectric power development in the area covered by the Agreement* on October 21<sup>st</sup> and of the *Subcommittee on the implementation of specific commitments regarding mining activities in the Nachicapau Lake Area* on November 9<sup>th</sup> to initiate the implementation of the respective work plans;
- Participation in a debriefing meeting on the Cambrien / Nachicapau / Fort McKenzie 2021 fieldwork campaign on October 27<sup>th</sup> with the NNK, the MELCC and two archaeologists.

## 6. PARK PROJECTS

### Parc National Iluiliq Project

- The planned Working Group meeting for Iluiliq National Park Project on November 3<sup>rd</sup> in Salluit had to be postponed to a later date due to the regional Covid-19 situation and travel restrictions.

## 7. PARKS

### General

- Considering the late reopening of the region for tourism due to the pandemic, Nunavik Parks prioritized to offer activities to Nunavimmiut (youth cultural camps, elders, students, autonomous visitors, short packages, etc.);
- Wardens and conservation and educational specialists participated with Quebec Wildlife Protection Officers in helicopter patrols in each of the 4 parks;
- Meetings with administrative technicians from all parks took place in Kuujjuaq end of September. Meeting program included presentation of annual report and objectives, specific training and workshops;
- A one week meeting with all park wardens took place in Wiyâshâkimî early October. The program included workshops, maintenance training and training with wildlife protection officer;
- Released new touristic maps for all parks, also available on the application Ondago;
- Annual Visitor experience officers meeting postponed due to the current situation;
- 2022 packages dates and information have been released on Nunavik Parks website;
- Emma Cain was hired as a Visitor experience technician in Kuujjuaq;
- Gabriela Rojas-Hevia was hired as a Safety and infrastructure specialist;

### **Pingualuit**

- As of October, there were 191 visitors in the park and 346 at the visitor center during this period;
- Matilita Tukkiapik was hired in August as administrative technician;
- Park director and administrative technician made four presentations to Secondary classes on October 14 at Arsaniq School;
- Qiallak Qumaaluk gave inugait bones and ajagaaq string games workshop to staff and high school students on October 7;
- A film crew *L'effet Papillon* went to Kangirsujuaq and Pingualuit to film one of the 30 minutes series at the beginning of September;
- Staff went to Pilukallak's site in Qingngua with elder Lukasi Nappaaluk for the planning of Qingngua and Qulusuttalik package and to continue learning the culture and history as well as a team building activity for staff;
- Wardens and helpers went to Qingngua and Qulusuttalik to repair and re-position some inuksuit on the trail to Pingualuit at the end of October;
- Pingualuit employees and some Kuujjuaq employees went to close up Manarsulik camp at the end of September;
- Visitor experience officer went to work in Kuujjuaq for a week to assist with customer service.

### **Kuururjuaq**

- As of October, there were 62 visitors in the park and 50 at the visitor center during this period;
- Delivered 3 Iberville packages, each package with a warden and local helper. 10 clients for Iberville plus 2 guides each package;
- Delivered 2/3 weekend. Third package had to cancel due to weather. 14 clients for weekenders plus 2 guides, 1 cook and elder for each trip;
- 4 trips of local student groups daytrip seal hunting with parks team as guides for total of 38 students along with their teacher for each trip;
- Maintenance work at upper koroc, Iberville basecamp and Quurlutuarjuq;
- The Visitor experience officer went to work in Kuujjuaq for a week to assist with customer service;
- Assisted in a search and rescue at the mouth of the river in September as set out in the procedures.

### **Ulittaniujalik**

- There were no visitors in the park during this period;
- Undertook environmental monitoring (water quality, water temperature);
- Drafted development plan.

### **Tursujuq**

- As of October, there were 36 visitors in the park and 49 at the visitor center during this period;
- 2 packages including local woman's group;
- Welcome Snap Quebec with their first Plan Nous participant. This project aims to create links through the meeting of representatives of different communities, and to discover the richness of our landscapes and enhance the biocultural diversity of Quebec;
- Whapmagoostui Junior Rangers attended canoe expedition in Wiyâshâkimî;
- Environmental monitoring conducted by the Conservation and education specialist in areas of the park for water levels, biodiversity with the assistants of the wardens;
- Undertook monitoring of tidal patterns of Tasiujaq lake;
- Harmonisation Committee meeting was held by videoconference on October 26<sup>th</sup>. The summer report and research and conservation work were presented.
- Johnny Kasudluak was hired as a park maintenance technician;
