### **ACTIVITY REPORT DECEMBER 2024 TO FEBRUARY 2025**

#### **MANDATE AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

1. Fishing and Trapping Support: program administration, technical assistance to community programs and management of the regional program
  2. Uumajuit Wardens: wildlife protection on the land in the marine sectors
  3. Environmental: technical assistance to the Northern Villages, environmental monitoring, research, climate change and environmental projects
  4. Land Use Planning: technical assistance to the Northern Villages and regional planning
  5. National parks development and operation
- 

#### **1. INUIT HUNTING, FISHING AND TRAPPING SUPPORT PROGRAM**

- First payment totaling \$4,142,275 in community grants paid to NVs; also 50% advanced for fur/clothing and inuliqtaik
- Tender for Salluit community boat completed, and building of vessel now underway
- Meeting held in Kuujuaq with half of coordinators participating. Topics included: HSP agreement, invoicing/budgeting, tender process, lost equipment, and visit to tannery to demonstrate how fur is handled
- Captain's training on (SVOP) Small Vessel Operator Proficiency; all six that took the course passed and received certificates.
- Looking to purchase equipment for community freezers; each NV being contacted
- Community visit to Aupaluk completed

#### **2. UUMAJUIT WARDENS PROGRAM**

- By the end of 2024, 1,444 days of patrol days reported, as well as 24 days of search and rescue assistance to municipalities; 441 weekly reports submitted
- In 2025 so far, 60 days of patrolling days reported with one day of search and rescue, as well 19 weekly reports submitted
- Regular Weekly telephone meetings held with Québec Wildlife Protection Officers (MFFP) and DFO representatives, all wardens active
- Statistics reporting ongoing with each warden of beluga sightings and harvests along with monitoring of hunting daily harvests
- As part of Nunavik Indigenous Guardians Initiative, wardens continue to document and report observations on environmental and climate changes on the land
- The department participated in monthly meetings of KRG/DFO Liaison Committee
- Recruitment of a warden in Aupaluk is ongoing

- We are working with KRG IT Section and wardens on technical issues to facilitate missing weekly reports
- Uumajuit Warden's Coordinator provided Auxiliary Coast Guard courses in four communities; 2025 courses are planned for Ivujivik, Kangirsuk, Akulivik, and combined course in Sorel for 15 staff from Nunavik
- Firearms safety course given at Expo Canadian Royalties mine site by the Uumajuit Warden's Coordinator, with four courses planned in February and March 2025
- Uumajuit Warden's Coordinator and Renewable Resources Assistant Director have been invited to the Yukon North Slope conference on Indigenous Conservation Economies; focus is on guardians and on-the-land programs (supporting community and culture)
- Uumajuit Warden's Coordinator participated in project to teach first aid to Inuit instructors
- Tender process for fleet upgrade is ongoing; NV slated to get replacement ATVs on first sealift are Kangiqsualujjuaq, Aupaluk, Salluit and Ivujivik; for snowmobiles we will advise once procurement process begins

### 3. ENVIRONMENT

#### Residual Material Management

- **Composting Projects**
  - Kuujjuaq:
    - Composting site and building established, necessary equipment installed
    - Call for tenders issued for building mechanical work and purchase of equipment and electrical work
    - Operations set to begin during summer 2025
  - Kangiqsualujjuaq:
    - Operations scheduled to start in 2025
  - Kangiqsujuaq:
    - Project approved by NV and site selected
    - Contract signed in February for purchase of composting equipment
    - Site construction planned for summer 2025
  - Communication tools in production; composting video created to raise awareness among population and organizations in Inukjuak, Kuujjuaq and Kangiqsujuaq
- **Drop-off points and eco-centre projects**
  - Kuujjuaq:
    - KRG and NV of Kuujjuaq staff and elected members visited Schefferville eco-centre and met with municipality team to view operations' progress
    - Training provided to new NV coordinator
    - Project is operational
  - Inukjuak:
    - Site completed in November and equipment installed
    - Training provided to NV operator and safety equipment ordered
    - Operations start during spring 2025
  - Tasiujaq and Aupaluk:
    - Construction at both sites completed; both sites operational
    - Training provided to NV operators in fall 2024
    - Communication tools ordered
    - NVs will decide on opening date
  - Kangiqsualujjuaq and Kangirsujuaq:
    - Both sites ready for operations
    - NVs are in process of hiring employees
  - In 2025: Akulivik, Ivujivik, Kangirsuk, Quaqtaq and Umiujaq will have drop-off points; call for tenders to purchase equipment issued in January

- **Selective Collection Project:**
  - Kuujjuaq: Engineering plans under preparation, with construction scheduled for summer 2025
- **Metal recycling project:**
  - Aupaluk: Metal residues sent by barge to South in November (removal of 670 tons of recycled metal from community)
  - Quaqtaq: Completion of metal recycling work ends in November; transportation of metal (bales and end-of-life vehicles) will be completed in 2025
  - Kangiqsujuaq: Metal equipment arrives in July for launch of projects with KRG team. New loader has been purchased, and call for tenders to purchase accommodation (camp) launched in February
  - Umiujaq: Call for tenders launched in February to recycle metal residues in 2025
- **Waste-to-Energy Project:**
  - Kuujjuaq: Preparation of technical specs for feasibility study on incinerator underway

**Granular Material Management:**

- The KRG, NV of Inukjuak, and Pituvik Landholding Corporation partnered to survey new potential sand pit in summer 2024; final report presented to the NV in January 2025
- NV of Kangiqsualujjuaq requested support to prepare 2024 invoices for granular materials due to staff shortages; template updated and explained to NV staff in January 2025

**Spill Management**

- During the period, nine spills were reported to the KRG: five from mining companies and four reported or observed by regional organizations
- Constant follow-ups made with stakeholders responsible for oil spills, and regular communication maintained with MELCCFP
- Workshop on coastal sensitivity issues in event of maritime incident held in Kangiqsualujjuaq with representatives from federal (Coast Guard) and provincial (CEGRIM) governments

**Climate Change and Environmental Monitoring**

- Participated in meeting (November 2024) of Nunavik climate change interim committee for approval of projects submitted under Climate Change Inuit Leadership funding program
- Approval of three projects by committee:

- Participated in meeting with Makivvik on establishment of future climate change committee for implementation of Nunavik climate change adaptation strategy (December 2024)
- Participated in Arctic Net's climate change conference (December 2024, Ottawa)
- Presentation of Climate Change Inuit Leadership funding program to NRBHSS climate change committee (December 2024)

## Regional Environment

- Caniapiscau Watershed Abandoned Outfitting Camp Clean-up:
  - Financial report submitted in December 2024. Project now coming to an end as there is no more budget in the ECCC envelope; final report being prepared
  - During 2024 summer season, 11 camps were cleaned up but not dismantled. All hazardous waste and residual materials removed and sent to treatment facilities. Total of 51,500 pounds of waste removed in 2024
  - Since beginning of this project in 2020, 15 permanent outfitting camps cleaned up in Caniapiscau watershed area. Total of 82,000 pounds of waste removed, and close to 80 mobile camp sites inspected and considered remediated
- Mid-Canada Line:
  - Contract signed with external firm to draft health and safety prevention plan for project
- Water
  - Water source protection: Drinking water source vulnerability reports for Kangirsuk and Kangiqsujuaq finalized; English version of reports will soon be shared with NV
- Regulation changes by Québec Government:
  - KRG attended information meeting on amendments made to regulations on sale, rental and granting of real estate rights on lands in domain of the State; key changes that apply to Nunavik are:
    - Environmental site characterization required before signing a new lease or when transferring a lease to new owner
    - Leases easier to obtain because business plan no longer required
  - KRG attended information meeting on Bill 63 amendments to Mining Act; main changes that apply to Nunavik are:
    - Québec Government must notify communities within 60 days when claims are bought in their area of interest. An email with Excel spreadsheet of all new claims will be sent to community representatives; this information also available on GESTIM
    - Companies must hold information session in nearest community at least 30 days prior to exploration field campaign
    - KRG and other Nunavik organizations can sign agreements with Québec Government to protect areas of interest for harvesting, traditional or cultural purposes
    - On agreement, inspection role can now be transferred to organizations outside MRNF
    - To prevent speculation, claim owners must send proof of work on claims to Québec Government
    - Claim owners require permit from MRNF mining sector to build temporary camps; this permit is renewable annually

## 4. LAND USE PLANNING

### Regional Planning

The department provided feedback on proposed development projects and new legislation, including to:

- Raglan mine on a wind farm project (currently undergoing impact assessment)
- MRNF on regulation respecting sale, lease and granting of immovable rights on lands in domain of the state

## Municipal Planning, Expansion Plans and Technical Assistance Program

- KRG Land Use staff met with:
  - NV of Quaqtaq to present latest version of master plan update and collect inputs; next meeting planned for end February
  - NV and LHC of Aupaluk to start process of master plan update
- Assistance provided to NV of Umiujaq on tank farm relocation
- With the help of Avataq, we prepared interviews with community Elders to gather insights on community histories, growth and changes; interviews will be integrated in new community master plans
- We began analyzing and mapping potentially contaminated sites in all communities to monitor risks associated with past or current land use activities
- Technical assistance provided to 14 NV to help with civic number attribution; database is updated continuously with each new number assignment. Also, addition of NV civic numbers and street names on Google maps is ongoing, and will be updated annually
- Preliminary engineering plans for Salluit 4 expansion zone reviewed following community feedback; visit scheduled in March to meet with NV and LHC representatives
- Discussions continue with NLHCA and consultants to develop online web platform for issuing permits
- Natural hazards map, geology, permafrost and other maps originally produced by Centre d'études Nordiques updated for Quaqtaq and Inukjuak

## 20% Protected Areas

- We participated in meetings of subcommittee on implementation of specific commitments on mining activities in Nachicapau Lake Area; discussions continue on conditions to be issued within future Reserve to the State
- Participated in meetings of Nordic Conservation Areas (NCA) Pilot Project Committee:
  - Work plan being drafted to identify territory for pilot project in area of interest to Naskapis, and test implementation of 30% mechanism
  - KRG is supporting Naskapi Nation representatives on committee in planning consultation in Kawawachikamach for selection of territory for pilot project
- Nunavik Protected Areas Consultation Phase 2:
  - Four pre-engagement sessions held virtually in February with Kangiqsujuaq, Kangirsuk, Quaqtaq and Tasiujaq
  - Engagement session held in December in Kuujuaq with representatives from Kuujuaq, Kangiqsualujuaq and Kawawachikamach

### **Parc national des Pingualuit**

- Park director and park coordinator resigned; job postings being advertised
- Invitation to submit offers for renovation of park pavilion presented to three bidders; the firm Blouin-Orzes selected
- Park wardens and maintenance technician worked on maintenance of snowmobiles and qamutiks for upcoming winter package

### **Parc national Kuururjuaq**

- Wardens worked on maintenance of skidoos for upcoming winter package
- Building and maintenance of qamutiks completed
- Wardens pitched tent poles at Qamanialuk area for locals to use, and for winter package pit stop to warm up before heading to Qurlutuarjuq
- Preparation of sealift items for infrastructure and operation made
- Meal preparations for upcoming winter package completed
- Park warden Matthew Hubloo Etok hired as third park warden
- We took possession of books for our self-serve library that contains cultural and scientific literature on territory of Nunavik
- Service contract awarded to Yamnuska, a new mountain guide, for Iberville package
- The team, maintenance technician and project manager worked on list of materials needed for this summer's construction projects in the park
