**ACTIVITY REPORT  
June to September 2021**

Mandates and responsibilities:

- Inuit Hunting, Fishing and Trapping Support Program: overall program administration, technical assistance to the Community programs and management of the regional program;
- Uumajuit Wardens Program: wildlife protection on the land in in the marine sectors;
- Environmental Program: technical assistance to the Northern Villages, environmental monitoring, research, climate change and environmental projects;
- Land Use Planning: technical assistance to the Northern Villages and regional planning;
- National Parks development and operation.

**1. INUIT HUNTING, FISHING AND TRAPPING SUPPORT PROGRAM**

- At the end of July, the second HSP payments to the communities for 2021 totaling \$3,362,189 were deposited to the Community HSP accounts;
- Construction of the new Puvirnituaq HSP boat should be completed in October with delivery next spring;
- The HSP Regional Agent is in communication with the Communities with respect to their requirements for maintenance and planning is underway for the renewal of their safety equipment early next year;
- Technical assistance is being provided to Kuujjuaraapik and Kangirsualujjuaq for the planning of their barge projects;
- The Umiujaq HSP Community Freezer construction has been completed, in collaboration with MPW;
- Inspections of the Community freezers will resume this fall subject to travel restrictions;
- Nunavik Land Mobile Radio project:
  - Telephone meetings were held with Kangirsualujjuaq, Tasiujaq, Aupaluk, Kangirsuk, Quaqaq, Ivujivik, Inukjuaq, Umiujaq and Kuujjuaraapik.
  - Technical specifications were finalized and a public call for tenders titled “Design, Supply, Installation and Maintenance of Land Mobile Radio Systems and of User Equipment” was launched on May 13; unfortunately no bid met the technical and legal requirements: consultants are revising the technical specifications and a new public call for tenders will be launched in September with the equipment and buildings to be delivered on the first sealift next year.
- Firearms registration and Canadian Firearms Safety Courses will be delivered this fall in collaboration with the Nunavik Police Service.

**2. UUMAJUIT WARDENS PROGRAM**

- As of the end of August the wardens completed 675 patrol-days this year and 7 days of search and rescue assistance;
- Weekly telephone meetings with Quebec Wildlife Protection Officers (MFFP) DFO

representatives and all wardens are active and ongoing;

- Statistics reporting on Beluga sightings and harvests along with monitoring of hunting on a daily basis, ongoing with each warden;
- Joint Patrols with MFFP and wardens from Kuujuaq, Kangiqsualujuaq, Kangirsuk, Salluit, Umiujaq and Kuujuaapik; additional joint patrols with MFFP and DFO are being planned;
- A number of complaints have been received from Communities regarding non beneficiaries fishing and the Wardens have been monitoring and verifying sport fishing permits. There have been also multiple reports regarding private helicopters and small aircraft fishing. Files have been opened and investigations on-going by MFFP;
- Assisted DFO survey team in the realization of the beluga survey on the Hudson Bay coast with wardens from Inukjuaq, Umiujaq and Kuujuaapik;
- As part of the Nunavik Indigenous Guardians Initiative, the Wardens continue to document and report observations on environmental and climate changes on the land;
- Participated in the monthly meetings of the KRG/DFO Liaison committee;
- Covid 19 guidelines being followed by all wardens;
- Recruitment for a warden in Quaqtaq on going.

### **3. ENVIRONMENT**

#### **Residual Material Management**

- Nunavik Residual Material Management Plan 2021-2027: revision completed and documents have been sent for final comments to Recyc-Québec;
- Participated to the 9<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Nunavik Waste Management working group in June, the main items on the agenda were the Nunavik Residual Material Management Plan 2021-27, the implementation of different recycling program in the region and the difficulty of accessing the various sources of funding for waste management at both the federal and provincial levels;
- Management of the residual hazardous materials stockpile site cleanup program: clean up have been completed in Salluit in June, Quaqtaq in July, Akulivik and Kangiqsualujuaq in August;
- Participated in the KEAC and BAPE Public Hearings on ultimate waste that was held during June 9-10 in Kuujuaq; during the hearing sessions, the regional organizations, the Northern Villages and the population were invited to submit their briefs or comments, the main discussion was about the open burning of waste and the difficulties to have access to source of funding at municipal level for operations and implementation of new waste management measures;
- Ahmed Kooki has been hired as environment specialist for waste management files.

#### **Spill Management**

- Continued the monitoring and follow-up of hydrocarbon spill reports, and provided added support to the regional organizations in regards to environment regulations and clean-up procedures;
- During this period, there were 49 spill were reported to the KRG, 15 from mining companies and 34 have been reported or observed from regional organizations;
- Technical assistance was provided to:
  - The NV of Kangiqsujuaq for completing two environmental rehabilitations;
  - The KRG MPW department in order to start the site rehabilitation at Kuujuaapik police station;
- Proceed to an environment characterization in Kuujuaapik for the proposed new area of development, the objective is to determine if there is existing contamination that need to be taken care of prior to development in this sector;
- Undertook environmental inspections on municipal building fuel tanks in Kangiqsujuaq, Kuujuaq, Kuujuaapik, Ivujivik, Salluit to identify leaks or possible non-compliances;

- Participated in a meeting with MELCC soil decontamination experts to include elements and constraints specific to Nunavik in the 2021-2024 Quebec Action Plan of the Soil Protection and Rehabilitation Policy;
- Following the publication of the new Quebec Regulation concerning the traceability of excavated contaminated soils, a series of comments have been sent to MELCC to ensure that the specific elements of Nunavik are taken into account and that those responsible for spills that occur on Nunavik territory are subject to the regulations.

### **Quarry and Borrow pits**

- At the end of June, an engineering study was realized in the Northern Village of Umiujaq concerning the feasibility of a river crossing to access a gravel pit on the north side of the Umiujaq River;
- In July, technical assistance was provided to the Northern Village of Akulivik concerning the management of the two new authorized gravel pits;
- In August, an archeology inventory was realized for the NV of Puvirnituk in the vicinity of the Uivaqqaq gravel pit;
- In July, meetings were held in the Northern Village of Salluit with the NV and Qaqqalik LHC concerning granular material issues and the old gravel pit restoration;
- In July, training on exploiting gravel pits was delivered to KI heavy machinery students in Kangiqsualujuaq;
- Granular inventory was realized in the Northern Village of Quaqtak at the end of August.

### **Climate Change Adaptation and Monitoring**

- Supported the completion of a video documenting a walrus hunt and the proper preparation of igunaq. Project led by the community of Quaqtak in partnership with Tumiit Media;
- Continued collaboration with Makivik in the development of a Nunavik Climate Change Adaptation Strategy. Community visits to present and verify the strategy is planned for Fall 2021/early winter 2022;
- Participated in a peer-to-peer sharing initiative with the Cree Nation Government supported by CIRNAC's Indigenous Community-Based Climate Monitoring program;
- Participated in and organized a Nunavik Climate Change Committee on Adaptation meeting on June 18: 2 projects were recommended for funding to CIRNAC's Climate Change Preparedness in the North (CCPN) program: Kangiqsujuaq Landholding's Snowmobile Boardwalk project and RNUK's LNUK Climate Change Network Initiative;
- Visited a site of "frost blisters" close to Aupaluk and informed the community members who brought it to KRG's attention of what occurred at the site.

### **Environmental Research**

- Nunavik Regional Research Authority (NRRA) steering committee: 2 monthly meetings for the assessment and planning for its implementation;
- Participated in meetings of the Inuit Nunangat Research Program Inuit Advisory Committee to review and make recommendations for project funding. A total of 11 projects, of which 3 are from Nunavik, were approved:
  - a study of Arctic char catches and stock assessment and winter disappearance in Tasirjuarusik led by Noah Eetook;
  - Walrus Health and Population Dynamics in the Context of Climate Change led by a biologist from Nunavik Research Center;
  - Marralik estuary beluga project led by RNUK;
- The Inuit Research advisor have participated in the Marralik estuary beluga project in August in collaboration with the Nunavik Research Center.
- Monica Nashak was hired as the Inuit Research Advisor;

## **Regional Environment**

- Attended the 168<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Kativik Environmental Advisory Committee in June; during this meeting was presented the Société Plan Nord action Plan 2020-2023 as well as the Québec plan for the development of critical and strategic minerals 2020-2025;
- Participated with the MELCC in the the Raglan mine environmental inspection in July and to the Canadian Royalties mine environmental inspection in August;
- Participated in a virtual information meeting in August with MELCC and Makivik Corporation concerning the planning of the Phase III of clean-up and dismantlement of the Mid-Canada Radar Line.

### Caniapiscau watershed abandoned outfitting camp clean-up:

- Meeting and site inspection in the Caniapiscau area with Naskapi representative in June and in August concerning abandoned outfitting camps;
- In collaboration with the MFFP, inspections of 30 mobile camp sites in the Caniapiscau area to verify that the sites are back to a natural state (update at the meeting);
- Workers from Kuujjuaq and from Kawawachikamach were hired for one week of field work in the Caniapiscau watershed area to finalize one camp clean-up and install thermographs in rivers in partnership with University INRS for monitoring the fish habitat.

### Nunavik Abandoned Mineral Exploration Restauration:

- Participate to Steering committee meeting in June for the NAMESR project;
- Workers from Kangiqsualujjuaq were hired for 2 weeks in June and July to help for dismantlement of abandoned mining exploration camps of Weymouth and Abloviak sites, final inspections were also done with community representative after the clean-up;
- Workers from Kangirsuk were hired for 3 days in middle of August for field work in Kangirsuk area to start the clean-up work on abandoned mining exploration sites across the river;
- Workers from Kuujjuaq were hired for 1 week from August 30 until September 6 for dismantlement of abandoned mining exploration camps of “Gerido” located about 80km south-west of Kuujjuaq.

## **4. LAND USE PLANNING**

### **Regional Planning**

- During this period, 2 projects of Land use occupations of category II and III were approved and one was refused;
- The KRG have published the updated Master Plan for the Kativik Region, as required by the Kativik Act; this Plan was adopted in February 2020 by the KRG Council and approved by the MAMH in February 2021;
- Initiate review of the land use articles within the Kativik Act;
- Following the issuance of letters of conformity for land use on the Kativik region, a total of 7 mining exploration sites have been inspected during two distinct inspection sessions (update at the meeting) .

### **Municipal Planning, Expansion Plans and Technical Assistance Program**

- Technical assistance was provided to:
  - Kangiqsualujjuaq, Kuujjuaraapik, Quaqaq, Kangiqsujuaq and Salluit for sites inspections and data collection on new development areas;
  - Kuujjuaraapik for pre-master plan meeting;
  - Quaqaq for organizing a virtual meeting on September 1 with all the stakeholders for discussion on future development and the lack of granular material;
- Kangirsuk Sustainable land-use planning project:

- Meeting, with NV and LHC representatives, presentation of the project and establishment of a local steering committee;
- Collection of info and data with surveyor on 3 different future expansion zones with the participation of local steering committee members;
- Upstream process of the Kangirsuk Pilot Project towards the realization of the Kangirsuk Village Master Plan
- Participate in discussions related to the MAMH National Strategy for revision of Quebec land use act, including changes in the Kativik act in term of land use planning articles;
- Coordination of current expansion area of the following community : Kangiqsualujuaq, Quaqtac, Puvirnituq, Kangiqsujuaq, Kuujuaq , Inukjuak.

### **Geomatics**

- Feasibility study of new airstrip in Ulittaniujalik park;
- Collaboration with MPW department for producing leases maps for community infrastructure, this work will facilitate the process for funding request related to future infrastructures;
- Collaboration with the MERN for the orthophotos and lidar acquisition of all the communities of the Ungava coast;
- Produced maps for:
  - Tursujuk park;
  - Community basemaps for: Akulivik, Kangiqsujuaq, Kangirsuk, Kuujuaq and Quaqtac;
  - Hydro-Québec staffhouse in Ivujivik;
  - Fire safety basemap for the fire department of Kuujuaq;
- Extraction of coordinates for the Cambrien Lake and Nachicapau lake for a biodiversity study
- Collaboration with the Civil Security department for the management of new building numbering systems in the NV's;
- Provide assistance to NV of Akulivik for the numbering system readjustment;
- Collaboration with regional organisations to create a new online database of existing buildings in the community.

## **5. PROTECTED AREAS**

### **20% Protected Areas**

- Meeting of the *Implementation Committee of the Specific Agreement to Preserve the Cambrien Lake / Nachicapau Lake / Fort Mackenzie (Waskaikinis) Area*: tabling and approbation of the work plans for the implementation of the specific commitments regarding mining activity and the search for alternatives to hydroelectric power development;
- Submission of the final activity report to the ministry of Forest, Wildlife and Parcs (MFFP) within the framework of the Sustainable Forest Management Plan (PADF) for the year 2020-2021;
- *Cambrien Lake / Nachicapau Lake / Fort Mackenzie (Waskaikinis) Area* knowledge acquisition fieldwork campaign:
  - KRG funding granted to the Naskapi Nation of Kawawachikamach for the realization of the fieldwork campaign;
  - Inventory of micromammals in the study area performed by KRG staff to assess the diversity of species and their distribution.

### **30% Northern Conservation Areas**

- Submission of KRG's position and recommendations regarding the pre-consultation process leading to the submission of a proposal for a Northern Conservation Area designation mechanism, which targets 30% of the Plan Nord territory.

## 6. PARK PROJECTS

### Parc National Iluiliq Project

- Identify potential sectors for landing trips within the Iluiliq National Park project;
- Visit and analyze potential landing strips with an Air Inuit pilot within Iluiliq National Park Project to assess those potentials;
- Promote good practices around the thick-billed murre colony near Cape Wolstenholme; drafts will be presented to Iluiliq Working Group member at the next meeting.

## 7. PARKS

### General

- Considering the late reopening of the region for tourism due to the pandemic, Nunavik Parks priorityzed to offer activities to Nunavimmiut (youth cultural camps, elders, students, autonomous visitors, short packages, etc.);
- Summer operations for Nunavik visitors started on July 19<sup>th</sup>;
- Refresher course was delivered by a Quebec wildlife protection officer to all wardens to renew their status as wildlife protection assistant;
- Hiring of 8 students and 1 intern for the summer;
- A list of over 60 community helpers available to assist Nunavik Parks' teams in the communities was collected.

### Pingualuit

- As of early August, there have been 45 visitors in the park and 56 at the visitor center during this period;
- Visitors in the park included Puvirnituaq grade 5 class, Kangirsujuaq summer camp and weekend visitors and Elders from Quaqtuaq and Kangiqsujuaq;
- Hiring of 3 summer students;
- 20 people applied for community helper positions including elders;
- Staff with 15 local youth had a workshop on local plants with Lukasi Nappaaluk;
- All the park staff and a few residents had Inuit and Dene games training with Uttuqi Tukkiapik and Penina Chamberland, KRG recreation technicians;
- An airstrip survey was conducted by helicopter on July 12 to find potential alternative locations for airstrips in collaboration with Air Inuit. Assessment of actual airstrip was done to plan the work in order to meet Transport Canada regulations;
- On July 12-14, wardens and helpers went to Manarsulik to do construction and maintenance work;
- Environment monitoring conducted by the Conservation and education specialist (water quality, water level, climate chang, water temperature);
- Environment Canada went to Manarsulik on July 28 to do the maintenance on the weather station;
- Harmonization committee meeting was held in Kangiqsujuaq on June 8.

### Kuururjuaq

- As of early August, there were 8 visitors into the park and 37 at the visitor center during this period;
- YES youth groups from Kuujjuaq and Kangiqusalujjuaq went to Qurlutuarjuq;
- Maintenance work was done at the Upper Koroc camp;
- Parks boat with Parks warden and 2 locals and Uumajuit warden boat both went on search and rescue to the tip of Quebec and Labrador to deliver drums of gasoline to sukkaļijuaq search and rescue boat. Towed back local and Nunavut boat on their way back;

- Environment monitoring conducted by the Conservation and education specialist along with park staff and residents (dwarf birch survey, paper birch survey, climate change monitoring, water level and temperature, water quality, snow depth, teledetection);
- August 13-15, first of 3 weekend packages at Quurlutuarjuq camp, 6 clients each trip with warden, elder and a cook;
- August 15-20, 1<sup>st</sup> of 3 mount caubvick (aka Iberville) packages along with 2 park staffs for each trip;
- Elder trip by boat in collaboration with Qarmaapik;
- Over 20 people applied for community helper positions including elders;
- Harmonization committee meeting was held in Kangiqsualujjuaq on June 15.

### **Ulittaniujalik**

- There were 6 visitors in the park during this period;
- Youth scientific program was held at Pyramid Camp for 4 days. 6 students from Kangiqsualujjuaq were helping with environmental monitoring work including butterfly and moth survey, water quality, benthic macroinvertebrate survey, bumble bee survey along with conservation and education specialists and visitor experience officer;
- An airstrip survey was conducted to find potential locations for airstrips in collaboration with Air Inuit;
- Environmental monitoring conducted by the Conservation and education specialist;
- Harmonization committee was held in Kuujjuaq on June 17.

### **Tursujuq**

- There were 99 visitors in the park and 46 at the visitor center during this period;
- Offered 3 packages in June and 2 in July with locals from Nunavik;
- Set up of the the floating dock at Isuak and at Sukkuq River;
- Hiring of 3 summer students, 1 to work with administrative technician and 2 warden assistants;
- Over 20 people applied for community helper positions including elders;
- Environmental monitoring conducted by the Conservation and education specialist in areas of the park for water level, biodiversity with the assistants of the wardens;
- Local cultural traditional helpers were hired to bring more experience to visitors.
