



Winter Checklist For Nunavik Municipalities

Extreme Winter Conditions

Planning - Preparation

- Register for the [Alert me](#) service from Environment and Climate Change Canada to receive the latest weather alerts issued for your area.
- Follow Us – Weather Alerts are posted to KRG's Facebook page.
- Have conversations ahead of time with key regional and local organizations so you can provide comfort zone services when needed.
- Identify and ensure your emergency operation centre is always equipped with or can be connected to a generator.
- Locate the generator, test and ensure good function ahead of winter, and make sure you have enough fuel supply on hand.
- Maintain an up-to-date Warning and Mobilization Plan that identifies the person responsible for opening a comfort zone service centre.
- Plan for and test back-up communication methods in the event of telecommunications failure.
- Ensure that essential municipal services can be delivered during extreme winter conditions. Pay special attention to the water treatment plant, and water and sewage services.
- Identify and ensure essential municipal workers are available.
- Identify a priority route for snow clearance for ensure emergency vehicles.
- Make sure there is enough fuel on hand for these vehicles.
- Encourage residents to prepare a 72-hour toolkit to be self-sufficient in case of extreme weather conditions and emergencies
