## **Kativik Regional Government Partners with Makivvik Corporation to Announce Climate Change Adaptation Strategy: A Shared Vision for a Resilient Nunavik**

**Kuujuuaq, Quebec, April 18, 2024** — The Kativik Regional Government (KRG) today announced a commitment to work closely with Northern partners to implement the Nunavik Climate Change Adaptation Strategy (NCCAS) led by the Makivvik Corporation.

The NCCAS aims to empower Nunavimmiut to adapt to fast-evolving environmental changes sweeping the North. More importantly, this is the result of extensive, multi-year collaboration and consultation by NCCAS partners, including the KRG, with Nunavik municipalities and organizations.

The KRG has contributed to shaping a comprehensive strategy that seeks to protect the health, well-being, and cultural vibrancy of Nunavik Inuit. The NCCAS intends to help Nunavimmiut prepare for climate change impacts, and to elevate climate change adaptation and resilience.

In combining efforts with the region's municipalities and service organizations, the NCCAS partnership reaffirms a commitment to elevating the capacity of all Northern Villages to improve the resilience of future and existing homes and community infrastructure; and, to secure firmer and more assured access to areas of subsistence including food security and drinking-water supply.
