TERRITORIAL DRIVER'S LICENCE

This licence makes you more eligible for higher-paying jobs that require a driver's licence by allowing you to drive a road vehicle on roads that are not connected to the provincial road network.

- Step 3. Photocopy 2 pieces of ID

Territorial Driver's Licence



A. What is a territorial licence?

The territorial licence authorises its holder to drive a road vehicle or a combination of road vehicles on roads that are not connected to the provincial road network. Holders of the territorial licence are subject to the same laws governing licence suspensions, fines and criminal code offenses as apply to other Quebec drivers.

Notes:

- 1) You cannot apply for a territorial licence and for a higher licence at the same time;
- 2) The territorial licence must be renewed every year (84.69\$ + demerits if applicable);
 - a. The Société de l'Assurance Automobile du Quebec (SAAQ) sends a yearly reminder on the month of your birthday, informing you of the total cost of renewal.

B. Requirements:

- Be at least 16 years of age for a Class 5, 6A, 6C or 8 licence (or be at least 14 years of age for 6D);
- Meet the health standards set out by SAAQ;
- Not be prohibited from driving;
- For minors, provide the written consent of a person having parental authority or a legal guardian.

c. Documents to enclose (2 pieces of identification):

1) <u>A valid piece of ID:</u>

- A Certificate of Indian Status, issued by Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada, which is required if you wish to be registered as an Indian;
- Birth Certificate (if issued after January 91994 by the Directeur de l'État Civil;
 Canadian Passport (or a Certificate of identity);
 Certificate of Canadian Citizenship;
 Attestation of known presence in Canada;
 Canadian Forces identity card;
 Identity card issued to an immigrant;
 Permanent Resident Card;
- 2) A second piece of ID:
 - $_{\circ}$ Health Insurance card; \circ Licence to drive a vehicle;
 - Valid piece of ID issued by a legally constituted body that controls the issue of the document and the information it shows (such pieces of identification must bear the holder's photograph and provide the information required for the application);
- 3) The Medical Examination Report , duly completed and signed by a general practitioner;
- 4) A money order payable to the SAAQ to cover the required fees;
